# **Steenblik Park** ROUND 2 ENGAGEMENT REPORT | November 2024



# Project Background

Located in the Rose Park neighborhood in District 1, Steenblik Park was selected to receive funding for improvements through the Parks, Trails, & Open Space General Obligation (GO) Bond, approved by voters in 2022.

In the summer of 2023, SLC Public Lands staff gathered public input during the first round of engagement to understand the park's current use, community's priorities, and desired improvements.

Based on the feedback, two concept designs were developed. SLC Public Lands conducted another round of public input, the results of which are summarized in this report, to ensure the designs captured the feedback we heard and to refine the final park design.








Most responses to "other" indicated they found out by word of mouth or an email from the city



This concept adds (1) pasture-like plants, native grasses and (2) an orchard of flowering trees to the park. (3) Terraced seating on the hillside is flexible for picnics or watching kids play at the expanded (4) toddler play area. An enlarged (5) gathering space with brightly colored furnishings embraces the cat sculptures and (6) a new walking loop with new trees frames the (7) flexible play field.


Note: (8) The existing play structure will be updated in both concepts to complement the refreshed design, and additional solar lighting is being explored.



This concept adds color to Steenblik Park using (1) wildflowers, native grasses, and an (2) expanded canopy of trees. Between the two upgraded play zones is a (3) covered picnic area where users can see the new toddlersized (4) slide with seating / climbing boulders emerging from the hillside. A meandering (5) seasonal walk draws users around the (6) flexible lawn space to the existing cat sculptures, with a nearby (7) labyrinth to explore and reflect. Muted site furnishing colors will complement the cat sculptures.

Note: (8) The existing play structure will be updated in both concepts to complement the refreshed design, and additional solar lighting is being explored.






Of the designs presented, which theme best reflects the identity and vision of the park?

# **Story & Theme Comments**

### **Open Comments**

- People leaned towards the elements in the "Great Basin" theme, but noted in comments that they would like to see the Steenblik family story amplified in some way.
- Respondents love the cat statues and are pleased they are staying in the park.

### How will feedback be addressed?

• Project team will find a way to pay tribute to the Steenblik family story.



# **Play & Recreation Comments**

### **Open Comments**

- There was an expressed desire for updated playground equipment, and for more toddler features.
- Comments noted the need to add shade and seating near the playground.
- Several commenters noted the need for more dog amenities such as a dog bag dispenser and a drinking fountain bowl.

#### How will feedback be addressed?

- Playground equipment will be updated, and current safety concerns will be addressed.
- Toddler play will be implemented in the final design.
- Shade and seating will be prioritized.
- Project team will explore dog amenities that can be added.

"...I have seen kids at that park not be able to do a lot of the equipment that is already there such as the big red circle thing younger children can't get up that. ...."

"Having just walked there to take my toddler to play, i think it's also key to ensure spaces for stroller parking."

"...I'd also love to see shade canopy's over the playgrounds."

"Seems like more people are moving to rose park with dogs than children, did we not consider dog items?"



# **Plantings & Trees Comments**

### **Open Comments**

- Commenters expressed excitement about native plants and the need to conserve water.
- There was a desire to keep the hedges on the north fence.
- Someone noted the need for routine maintenance, including addressing the dips that are safety hazards.

#### How will feedback be addressed?

- Benefits of native plants:
  - Lower maintenance needs Native plants adapt to the local climate and soil, requiring less intensive upkeep compared to non-native species.
  - Resource efficiency Native plants require less water, fertilizers, and pesticides to thrive.





# **Seating & Gathering Comments**

#### **Open Comments**

- A need for seating options near the playgrounds for caretakers.
- Overall, the results highlighted the importance of shade and comfortable seating areas for a variety of users.

How will feedback be addressed?

- Project team will explore adding updated picnic tables and linear seat walls.
- Shade canopies will be added.

"I would emphasize the need for comfortable seating. Some parks have had hostile architecture such as uncomfortable benches and armrests that break up the seating in order to discourage vagrancy or some such thing. That stuff is awful and should NOT be a part of this redesign. The people who use the park primarily live in the neighborhood and should have a comfortable refuge."

"I worry the lounge chairs would just become a hangout for homeless individuals."



# **Additional Information**

#### **Next Steps**

Public Lands staff will consult with technical experts, consultants, landscape architects, and maintenance supervisors to adjust the final design of the park based on feedback received. Once the design is finalized, Public Lands will go out to bid to select a contractor.

Construction is tentatively expected to begin in 2026.

• Which color palette do you think is most fitting for the park?




